SAFETY

Applicable to only Juniors in the U11 and U13 age groups: Use of a hard ball can create the possibility of injury. It is Club policy to comply with ECB directives regarding the playing and coaching of cricket and ECB safety guidance states that helmets with a faceguard should be worn when batting against a hard cricket ball in matches and practice sessions. Players should regard the helmet as a normal item of protective equipment when batting, together with pads, gloves and for boys, an abdominal protector (box). HPCC will provide pads, gloves and cricket equipment but it is the responsibility of parents to provide a helmet and protector. Every precaution will be taken to ensure that accidents will not happen, but coaches and supporting personnel cannot be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury suffered by any child.

PERMISSION FOR THE USE OF PHOTOGRAPHS & RECORDED IMAGES

The Club recognises the need to ensure the welfare and safety of all young people in cricket. Therefore, we will not permit photographs or video images to be taken or used without the consent of the Parent/Guardian and player. The Club will take steps to ensure that these images are used solely for the purpose of promoting and celebrating the Club's cricketing activities. If photographs e.g. team or action shots, are sent to the press, individuals will not be identified. In circumstances where there is a need to identify an individual player in the press parental permission will be sought beforehand.

DATA PROTECTION

The Club will use the information provided on this Membership Form (together with other information it obtains about the player) to administer his/her cricketing activity at the Club and in any activities in which he/she participates through the Club and to care for and supervise activities in which he/she is involved. In some cases this may require the Club to disclose the information to County Boards, Leagues and to the England and Wales Cricket Board. In the event of a medical issue or child protection issue arising, the Club may disclose certain information to doctors or other medical specialists and/or to police, children's social care, the Courts and/or probation officers and, potentially to legal and other advisers involved in an investigation. Upon completing the Membership form you will be provided with the Club Privacy Notice for Members and as the person completing this form, you must ensure that each person whose information you include in this form knows what will happen to their information and how it may be disclosed.
